- Use subdivision maps to help identify when land was subdivided.

Elgin and Kane County Directories

A city directory is the earliest form of a phone book. Directories can be used to find name of others living at the same address, and often provide clues as so where a resident was employed. For people researching house information for "code" purposes, it may provide clues about a house being previously subdivided.

- Elgin directories dating back to 1875
- Early directories list occupants alphabetically
- Beginning in 1900, names are also indexed by address
- Kane County directories available for years 1859-60, 1867, 1887-88, 1887-90
- Some years are available in print version

Elgin Newspapers

Newspapers can be useful for checking obituaries of former residents or owners, reports of building construction, mentions within social or gossip columns as well as providing a feeling for the history and the spirit of the time.

- · Local newspapers dating back to 1850's on microfilm
- Refer to the Local Newspaper Index if searching for a keyword, name, or location
- · The index is not complete though, so narrowing down a date and searching microfilm may be necessary

- · Available as photocopies for reference or on microfilm

APPENDIX: ADDRESS CHANGES IN ELGIN

House Numbering Changes

Elgin's House numbering system changed at least 3 times in the late 1800's. The first occurring in 1870's, followed by 1884, and lastly in 1894. The 1884 change adopted new baselines at Chicago St. (and Bridge St., now West Chicago St.) for north/south numbers, and the Fox River for east/west numbers.

Revised baselines for east/west streets were adopted in 1894. Liberty Street became the baseline on the east side, and the line followed by Vandalia, Union and McClure was the divider on the west side. Thus, the same house on the same location may have had three different house numbers, not to mention a different street name (below). Some alterations may have taken place in smaller, isolated instances since the 1894 event.

Street Name Changes

In April of 1894, the following street name changes were made:

Arbor St. and Preston Ave. changed to Preston Ave.
Bridge St. changed to West Chicago St.
Cleveland Ave. changed to Buckeye St.
Division St. and Pearl St. changed to Division St.
Hill St., Edward St. and Ashton Ave. changed to Hill Ave.
James St., William St. and Illinois St. changed to
Illinois Ave.

Race St. changed to Water St.
Summit St. and Willow changed to Summit St.
West National St. and Walnut Ave. changed to Walnut St.

Other street name changes include:

Alexander changed to River Bluff Broadway changed to North State Dexter St. changed to National St. Ettner Ave. changed to North Porter St. Galena Road changed to West Highland Ave. Grove changed to Lynch Lemonade changed to Wilcox Main St. changed to State St. Mill changed to Douglas Ave. Milwaukee changed to East Highland Ave. North Division changed to Jefferson Pinacle changed to Franklin Railway Ave. changed to Wellington Ave. River St. (west side) changed to Hendee St. River St. (east side) changed to Grove Ave. Summit St. changed to State St.
