Gail Borden Public Library Annual Report 2009-2010

This was a year filled with major accomplishments for the Gail Borden Public Library District. We opened the first branch library in the district to much fanfare and the delight of the community in August 2009. Due to a very generous donation from Tom and Sue Rakow, the library bears their name and is known as the Rakow Branch. In addition we completed construction of several new areas in the main library and mounted an impressive exhibit during the summer.

History was made this year when we received the highest national honor that a library can be awarded, the National Medal for Museum and Library Services. This recognition truly illustrates the strength, energy, and creativity that the Gail Borden Library exhibits on a daily basis. Our Library has a long history of accomplishments and in 2009-2010 we were able to receive the accolades that this institution so richly deserves.

New/Expanded Services

Circulation of materials - increased 16% and for the first time in history we circulated over 2 million items

Programs for the public - offered 1,617 programs (16% increase) with 66,471 people attending (32% increase)

Visitors - increased 14% to just over 1 million

Reference inquiries - increased 8%

Created joint partnership with Channing School parents and teachers to provide learning activities throughout the summer

Created the Walking Book Club

Established Teen Spanish Fiction collection

Created a national online resource sharing group for libraries who provide Spanish language programming

Launched Museum Adventure Pass which allows library cardholders to checkout free passes to suburban area museums

Expanded Book Club in a Bag collection with the addition of Playaways (integrated miniature players loaded with audio books)

Increased Volunteer Corps

Worked with City of Elgin to establish a library bus stop

Events and Programs of Note

Rakow Branch Grand Opening – showcased the model for the 21st century library with intuitive/customer friendly layout, self-service features, and an appealing/high interest collection of materials.

2010 Census Campaign – multitude of activities took place throughout the year to reinforce the 2010 Census, including a kickoff that displayed the largest census form in the world, visits from former Chicago Bears Super Bowl players, and Fiesta Flamenco, a Mardi Gras style event.

National Medal Community Celebration - drew large crowds and accolades and included a flash mob event!

Be A Hero: Read – Summer Reading Program which experienced a record breaking 20% increase in enrollment. Spider Man visit attracted over 900 people alone.

Discovery 2010 Science Fair – inaugurated this collaborative program with School District U-46 which showcased 150 projects created by 250 area students.

Black History Family Festival: A Musical Tale of African American History – another successful year with several thousand in attendance.

StoryTubes – program received international recognition with the 8th IFLA International Marketing Award 2010, 2nd place. There were 26 applicants from 13 countries.

Library Card Challenge: Year Two - saw a surge of high school students applying for library cards.

StoryCorps Project – additional "gift" for receiving the National Medal enabled us to record oral histories of 36 people in our community, all of which will be archived in the Library of Congress.

Community Garden – educated people about sustainable living and supplied fresh vegetables to local food pantries.

Bicycles on Parade – following on the heels of Rain Barrels on Parade, another very successful partnered event.

Communities Thrive @ Your Library - National Library Week featured themed programs throughout the week.

Unity in the Community Festival: Elgin's First Families

Home for the Holidays - first time this jointly partnered event has taken place.

Presentation/Live Webcast - NASA Head International Space Station Capcom Hal Getzelman – audience comprised of students from two schools.

World of Computers Saturday Summer Boot Camp - new series of adult computer classes.

Go Bilingual - language exchange program for English and Spanish speakers.

Elgin Hispanic Network - recipient of the 2010 Organization of the Year award
